The Art of Forgiving

Ephesians 4:31 -32

³¹"Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. ³² Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ, God forgave you."

James 1:2-8

What is sin?

- 1. Any activity or thoughts that are opposed to the will of God is sin, a transgression of God's law. I John 3:4-5; James 4:17
- 2. While all sin is against God, often they have real world repercussions against our fellow man. Matt. 18:15-16; I Sam. 2:25
- 3. When we have wronged another or been wronged, it can too easily lead to bitterness and cause additional strife. Heb. 12:14-15

Forgiveness through Grace:

- 1. Our forgiveness through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross was not deserved or earned. Eph. 2:8-9
- 2. Because of the complete work of the cross, all sins have been forgiven. Heb. 10:12
- 3. We are called to pass that grace forgiveness on to our fellow man. II Cor. 2:7

Forgiveness when it's not easy:

- 1. Disagreements and conflict are common, even amongst members of the church. Acts 15:36-39
- 2. Failure to forgiveness is often manifested in anger, bitterness, grudges, a malicious attitude, a lack of care or concern for another, acts of retaliation or revenge.
- 3. Satan does not want us to be forgiving, hoping to use the anger and bitterness to keep our eyes off the father and mired in worldly conflict. II Cor. 2:11
- 4. Forgiveness comes from the transgressed, without action form the transgressor. Luke 23:34
- 5. Remember that suffering is part of the Christian existence. I Peter 3:8-17
- 6. Have patience with those that have wronged you, lest you also stumble. Gal. 6:1-2
- 7. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Rom. 12:18
