# The Joy of Forgiveness

Acts 13: 38 Therefore, my friends, I want you to know that through Jesus the forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you.

Acts 13: 39 Through him, everyone who believes is set free from every sin, a justification you were not able to obtain under the law of Moses.

### What is Sin?

- 1. Any activity or thoughts that are opposed to the will of God is sin, a transgression of God's law. (1 John 3:4-5, James 4:17)
- 2. Sin is lawlessness, and unrighteousness, and through it we rebel against God. (<u>Deuteronomy 9:7; Job 13:23</u>)
- 3. The penalty of Sin is death. (Genesis 2:17; Romans 6:23)

### 3 types of Sin

- Imputed Sin through Adam. (<u>Romans 5:12</u>; <u>1 Corinthians 15:22</u>)
- Inherited Sin/Old Sin Nature. (Romans 7:17; Romans 13:14)
- 3. Personal Sin. (<u>1 John 1:8</u>)

# The Joy of Forgiveness (Continued)

#### **OT Sacrifices Covered Sin**

- 1. Throughout the Old Testament, blood was spilled in response to sin.
- 2. There was a protocol to dealing with Sin.
  - 1) Sins were to be confessed to God. (Psalm 32:5, Proverbs 28:13)
  - Presentation of Sin Offering (Leviticus 4:27-35). Note the word forgiveness in both the Old Testament and in the New Testament.
  - 3) National confession and cleansing. (Leviticus 26:40, Dan. 9:4-20)

#### The Ultimate Solution to Sin

- 1. Israel was told of the plan to pay for our sin through Prophecy. (Isaiah 53:12)
- 2. Jesus was born, completely God and completely man, knowing that His life would end in His death as payment for the sins of the world. (Matthew 16:21; Mark 8:31)
- 3. Jesus was the unblemished, perfect lamb to be sacrificed for the Sins of man. (1 Peter 1:19)
- 4. The work of Christ on the cross paid for all sins. (1 John 2:2)
- 5. Forgiveness comes from belief in the Lord, in that His sacrifice paid your debt. (John 3:36)
- 6. Nothing man has done or will do could come close to earning entry to heaven. It is a gift from God, to the undeserved. (Ephesians 2:8-9)
